

# The Refuge Country Club

## DRESS CODE

To ensure an enjoyable visit to our Club we ask that you review and observe the following policies:

### **Golf Course Attire**

Members and Guests are expected to wear appropriate golf attire.

**MEN** - Men are to wear slacks and shirts with collars or turtlenecks or mock turtlenecks. Shirts must be tucked in on the Golf Course and all practice areas. Bermuda style shorts are permitted on the Golf Course as long as they are no shorter than five inches (5") above the bend at the back of the knee or nineteen inches (19") in total length and no longer than the bottom of the kneecap. Billed hats must be worn with bill forward.

**WOMEN** - Women may wear shorts, slacks or golf skirts. Shorts and skirts may not be shorter than five inches (5") above the bend at the back of the knee or nineteen inches (19") in total length and no longer than the bottom of the kneecap. Women's golf tops must be tucked in unless designed to be worn outside and must not rise above the beltline at any time during the golf swing. Women's sleeveless tops must have a collar or high neck. Billed hats must be worn with bill forward.

Soft (non-metal) spikes are required at all times.

### **Tennis Court Attire**

Adult members and guests are to be dressed in appropriate tennis clothing. Non-tennis attire (including beach wear, cut-offs and basketball and running shorts) will not be allowed on the tennis courts. Men must wear collared shirts at all times (no sleeveless shirts or T-Shirts). Juniors are encouraged to wear appropriate tennis attire. All players must wear regulation tennis shoes on Club courts. Cross training, basketball and jogging shoes will not be allowed. Members are responsible for insuring that their Guests follow Dress Code policies.

### **Clubhouse Attire**

Informal sports attire, such as golf or tennis clothing, is appropriate. Cut-offs are not permitted, nor are blue jeans with visible tears or frayed edges. Shoes are required at all times. Men may not wear hats indoors in any part of the Club where food is served. For males age sixteen and older, collared shirts are required. Shirts such as turtlenecks, mock turtlenecks and dress shirts with "Henley" collars are also appropriate. Tank tops

and long sleeved cotton T-shirts are not permitted unless covered by a sweater, jacket or sport coat. Shirrtails may be worn out if the respective item of clothing was designed for outside wear.

Women's shirts or blouses may be worn out if the respective item of clothing was designed for outside wear.

### **Fitness Attire**

Members and Guests using the Fitness Center are required to wear shirts, shorts, and athletic shoes. Shirts and shorts must be clean and free of holes. Athletic or aerobics ensembles are acceptable; however appropriate cover-ups are required when leaving the building. For safety purposes, shoes must have closed toes and heels, and rubber soles. Bare feet are permitted only in the locker room areas (exceptions are made only in the case of a specific program held in the aerobics studio). The staff reserves the right to deny access to the Fitness Center if a Member or Guest's attire is considered unsafe or inappropriate.

### **Swimming Attire**

All swimmers must wear appropriate swimwear. "Cut-off" pants, athletic shorts or other garments not specifically designed for swimming are not appropriate. Any swim trunks with visible clothing underneath (boxer shorts, underwear, etc.) are not appropriate. Swimwear attire must be completely covered and shoes worn outside the fenced pool area. Uncovered swimsuits are not permitted on the Club grounds, in the parking areas or in the Clubhouse.

Children - Dress and conduct of children will, at all times, be suitable to the decorum of the Clubhouse. Children sixteen (16) years or under will have no access to any portion of the Clubhouse unless accompanied by a Member or by those holding Guest Cards. Children are not permitted to play or romp in the Clubhouse. Parents or other persons bringing children to the Clubhouse must keep them in their immediate presence and under their control.

The Staff has been instructed to and will strictly enforce this Dress Code. The Board of Directors has authorized Staff to ask any Member and/or Guest to leave Club premises should they be in violation of the Dress Code. It is the responsibility of each Member (when inviting Guests) to inform them of the Dress Code to avoid any possible embarrassment.
